PARTNER UPDATES

Ramsey Washington Metro Watershed District has an intern working on a **rain barrel information packet** and is trying to fill it with up-to-date information about rain barrels. If you have information about rain barrels that would be useful to include, please contact Louise Watson.

CGEE will be holding its annual **Rivers Institute** on July 24, 25, and 26. The course will bring educators out on the river to learn how rivers can be used to teach science and literacy. All spaces are full.

UPDATES ON METRO WATERSHED PARTNER ACTIVITIES

The **Metro Media Campaign** is going strong. The current focus is on two areas: a fall ad buy, and a coupon to be distributed as a WCOO State Fair bag stuffer. The TV ads will run on cable television networks such as CNN, ESPN, TWC, HGTV, etc., and the group is looking to spend \$20-40k for 3-5 weeks of coverage. The WCCO bag stuffer emphasizes a 'clean streets, clean water' message and directs people to the Clean Water MN website to access coupons for clean water. Funding for the Metro Media campaign is coming from cities, watershed districts, and member organizations. They are still looking for great stock photos of best management practices. Finally, improvements to the Clean Water MN website are being looked at.

The Minnesota **State Fair** is coming up August 24-September 4. Metro WaterShed Partners is running an exhibit in the DNR building, and volunteers are still needed. Contact Kate at 651-523-2812 or kknuth01@hamline.edu to sign up.

The McKnight Foundation grant has come through, with \$60,000 of funding over two years for the WaterShed Partners. Allianz is funding kiosk programs with \$10,000.

The first kiosk in a Minneapolis park has been installed in the Linden Hills Park.

The **internal organization small group**, which was formed to move forward the strategic planning, reported to the Partners. The small group has created a draft of a member information sheet, to be distributed to new members and referred to at Partner meetings. Currently, the group is working on descriptions for leadership positions in the organization. The internal organization small group has been holding regular conference calls to do this work.

Additional strategic planning small groups will update the Partners at future meetings.

PRESENTATION

Stormwater monitoring in an urban setting – John Mason, Capitol Region Watershed District

John Mason outlined the stormwater monitoring carried about the Capitol Region Watershed District. The District monitors a number of sites, testing stormwater run-off for pollutants. The District monitors storms with more than half an inch of rainfall, and John shared the specific data for suspended solids and phosphorous. Data were collected throughout 2005, and the number of sites has been expanded for 2006. The project may eventually help pinpoint sources of pollution by tracking trends of the level of pollutants in different areas of the District.
